

Lot Description

Among the legends of pro football, few individuals loom as large as "Broadway" Joe Namath. A com cockiness, showmanship and talent, Namath burst upon the New York scene in 1965 with the Jets. season Namath passed for 2,200 yards and 18 touchdowns, winning the AFL Rookie of the Year Aw following season he led all professional passers with 3,379 yards (which at the time was the fourth ever) and followed that up by cracking the 4,000 yard mark in 1967. All of those accomplishments, pale in comparison to his unprecedented performance in Super Bowl III. With the Jets huge underd powerful Baltimore Colts (one sportswriter predicted a 55-0 Colts victory), Namath stunned the spo confidently "guaranteeing" a win by the Jets. Dizzy Dean once remarked, "It ain't bragging if you can those sentiments were probably echoed by Namath at the time. The former Alabama star complete passes in the game for 206 yards, cooly leading the Jets to a stunning 16-7 victory and the AFL's fill Bowl victory over their more established NFL rivals. That win forever changed the course of pro fool resulted in the merger of the two Leagues the following year. Though Namath never returned to the remained one of the game's top quarterbacks until knee injuries significantly limited his playing effectiveness. In 1985 he received football's highest honor with his election to the Football Hall of F
